Rhetorical Analysis on Safwat Saleem

Saleem brings out a really important message or an example and that was the books in the library. If you think you will notice that the situation in the library is not noticeable. People won't even bother enough to find out. People don't even know that they have a big effect on someone's lifestyle when they talk bad about and make fun of the person who was giving him all that he has on the work. Not everyone is brave like Saleem and not everyone can ignore those harsh comments that they get in their life which drag them down without anyone realizing including the person who is suffering. Saleem is trying to send his message of not giving up even if the people around you bring you down because of how you speak to the Asian people who have different accents and also the people who have difficulties in speaking.

Safwat Saleem is a public speaker, film making, graphic designer, Visual artist. Saleem is from Pakistan so if He has a Pakistani accent. Saleem Best is known for making characters and giving

them his voice. In his talk show with TED, he talks about his words, his problems, and People's reactions to him. And Walt Wolfram is a North Carolina State University sociolinguist who specializes in social and racial dialects of American English. Through his work in Detroit in 1969, he was one of the early pioneers in the study of urban African American English. They both kind of have a similar way to look at things. What Walt Wolfram writes in his story directly applies to Safwat Saleem's childhood memories and when Saleem uploaded his first YouTube videos. Walt Wolfram brings up the point of Tanya getting attacked by her classmates without the classmates knowing how it is affecting her is remarkably similar to the comments Saleem received after he uploaded his videos. So, we can say that one's reality show is based on another's writing. And here we can see how both of the authors are getting bullied because of the same reason of having a different accent. And both of the writers have the same audience who they are talking to.

Before Saleem starts talking in TED, He gave a nice little introduction, and then he doesn't want it to make his speech boring so he went through the funny creations that he made to make people get more interested in his speech so he can start talking seriously about that fundamental problem. In his talk show with TED, he talks about his childhood or how he had problems talking and people used to laugh at him so he was getting so nervous that he will are used to never talk back to someone, or it was too shy to answer any question so used to stay quiet and run to the bathroom to avoid answering. He talks about his first time posting a video on YouTube and he also talks about the reaction you get from the YouTube video some of them were Encouraging to make more videos or the second part or as some of them were making fun of her accent tell him he is trash or garbage and uses A confident meter to show how his confidence get a booster and some few words take the boost away in like two seconds. On other hand, Walt

Wolfram's article "Everyone Has an Accent" provides an overview of how children with different accents are negatively impacted in the United States, as well as how awareness campaigns are being designed to promote a general understanding and appreciation of all people who appear to have different dialects. Wolfram begins the article by telling the story of Tanya, a young girl. Tanya has moved recently from her country to another country, and her fifth-grade classmates think she speaks in some kind of a different way on her first day of school. While her classmates are unconcerned, they are unaware of the underlying impact of their biases on Tanya and how hurtful their descriptions of her accent can be. And now both writers are ready to make their claims because they both have the audience's attention and emotion on them only.

After Saleem received the audience's attention he started to go deep inside to his main point that he is trying to tell the audience. Saleem mentions the point where he talks about how people do not know how much ashamed or unconscious, he is an about his voice, and he also says that the comments were mostly about his accent is raced on other hand he was trying to tell the audience that he was getting personally attack those Comments he was not getting attacked because of his work. And then he brings up the point where he tells the audience that the writer will find more errors in your writing. Give the reader why and he knows that the writer is black. Also, he brings up another point where he says white name applications are most likely to get accepted in the job than a black-sounding name. Also, he brings up another point is that people think something is normal because they experience it every day but that normal for them is not normal for the people who are suffering or going through those moments.

He also tells the audience that we think it is normal for a black student to have spelling errors, and for a female student not succeeding in her career or her life also he talks about white employees being better than black employees. He also gives an example of a library where he

talks about the results of a book percentage being 11% in 2014 and just a year before it was 8% here. Also, Walt Wolfram started to address the problems in society where Saleem can be one of the best examples who connect to his problems he is telling the audience. Walt Wolfram backs up Tanya's statement by educating her readers about a project designed to raise dialect awareness. This project helps teachers and students to discover how people continue to speak English through their different accents and dialects. Both writers Saleem and Walt are giving evidence and examples, experience to the audience. And at the end, he gave out his most important Line and that was "giving up is not an option." Similarly, Wolfram continues by expressing the realities and fictions about different languages. He explains that different dialects are culturally natural and neutral and that knowing this, we should not make judgments on people speaking dialects. And he also said that everyone is different, and we should respect each other by

complimenting their hard work and making them more confident so they will keep trying to get when they are trying to be successful and we should also avoid making any kind of jokes about someone's weakness. Wolfram proves that dialects have deep roots in various cultures, but nobody can avoid speaking in a dialect; we all speak in an accent, no matter who we are or where we come from. Individuals should feel inferior and worthless as a result of the stigmas affecting some dialects. Their own talents and personal characters are often judged, making them feel inferior and worthless. Both writers do a really good job explaining, giving evidence and giving advice to the audience so the audience will remember the speech they hear or the writing they read and can connect those points when the audience faces those moments in their everyday stuff. Now because of two authors, people will start thinking differently.
